BENEFITS UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' STATE INSURANCE SCHEME—REVIEW FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 1979

The Employees' State Insurance Scheme applies to 26 Centres in the State of Maharashtra and provides protection to 15,38,897 workers in the event of employment injury, Sickness and Maternity. This protection is made available in two ways, namely by provision of medical care and cash benefits when needed. During the month of August 1979, 14,011 Insured Person received Rs. 32,26,077.15 cash benefits due to employment injuries. This includes 4,703 persons who were in receipt of Pensions for Permanent Disablement and 1,784 persons who were in receipt of Dependant Benefit as dependants of deceased Insured Persons. During the month 10,528 accidents were reported as against 8,592 during the preceding month.

Comparatively fewer persons need the employment injury benefits but a fairly large number need Cash Benefit in the event of Sickness. During August 1979 1,14,262 claims were received and an amount of Rs. 88,24,955.00 was paid out as Sickness Benefit. During the preceding month 59,224 claims were received and an amount of Rs. 51,62,435.87 was disbursed as Sickness Benefit.

CONFINEMENT AND MATERNITY BENEFIT
Some Insured Persons suffering from T.B., Mental, Malignant, other long term diseases etc., require more attention and they are being paid additional benefit called Extended Sickness Benefit. During the month an amount of Rs. 8,14,668.45 paid towards this benefit.

During the month, 399 Insured Women workers claimed Rs. 6,07,483.05 by way of Maternity Benefit. The attendance at the dispensaries as per certificates received was 3,33,933 during the month.

During the month Funeral Benefit in 181 cases amounting to Rs. 18,094.80 was paid.

During the month Confinement charges in respect of wives of Insured Persons amounting to Rs. 1,01,009.95 were paid.

During the month an amount of Rs. 4,894.00 was paid as Enhanced Sickness Benefit to 33 Insured Persons who had gone under sterilisation operation for Family Planning.

For recovery of arrears of Contribution under the Scheme, Legal proceeding had to be initiated in 19 cases against defaulting employers.

Contribution recovered from the employers for the month of August 1979 is Rs. 10,60,477.40.

A sum of Rs. 10,60,477.40 has been deposited in the State Bank of India, Mumbai, for the payment of arrears of contribution.

Chances of the Government to take legal action against defaulting employers are very good.

Three of the disputes arose over questions of " pay, allowances and bonus issues ", 3 related to " Retrenchment and grievances about personnel ", while the remaining 9 were due to other causes.

Out of the 7 disputes that terminated during the course of the month, 2 were settled either entirely or partially in favour of the workers, 4 in favour of the employers, while the result of the remaining one dispute was indefinite.

*The word " Work stoppages " in the official sense means interruption of work and it is hereby used in that sense as virtually synonymous with " Strike ". In compiling statistics of the industrial disputes, however, disputes in which 10 or more persons are involved are included.

In August 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Jalgaon Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 364 being 11 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Jalgaon Centre.

The index number for the food group increased by 19 points to 406 due to a rise in the average prices of wheat, jowar, gramdal, moongdal, groundnut oil, vanspati, vegetables, banana, onions, sugar and gur.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 1 point to 421 due to a rise in the average price of kerosene.

The index number for clothing and footwear group decreased by 2 points to 329 due to a fall in the average prices of leather, cloth and garments.

The index number for the miscellaneous group decreased by 3 points to 279 due to a fall in the average prices of papleaf and utensils.

NANDED*

386—A rise of 23 points

In August 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for working Class (New Series) for Nanded Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 386 being 23 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Nanded Centre.

The index number for the food group increased by 32 points to 419 due to a rise in the average prices of rice, wheat, jowar, grinding charges, tur dal, moongdal, groundnut oil, salt, tamarind, mixed spices, vegetables, sugar, and gur.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 5 points to 473 due to a rise in the average prices of kerosene oil.

The index number for housing remained steady at 196 being the six monthly item.

The index number for the clothing and footwear group increased by 6 points to 347 due to a rise in the prices of cloth for trousers, long cloth and coloured fabrics.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 11 points to 310 due to a rise in the average prices of barber charges and rickshaw fare.

In August, 1979 the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New series) for the Solapur Centre with base year January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 373 being 5 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index number relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 Family Living Survey in Solapur City.

The index number for the food group increased by 6 points to 394 due to a rise in the average prices of groundnut oil, Vanaspati, goatmeat, beef, dry chillies, onions, garlic, vegetables, sugar and gur.

Explanatory Memorandum.

The Neyveli Lignite Corporation is an integrated undertaking in as much as it has mines as well as factory establishments. The employees engaged in mines of the Corporation were covered under the Coal Mines Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948 and those employed in factory were covered under the Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952. On the request of the Workers and the employer it has since been decided that both the mines and the factory of the Corporation should be brought under one Provident Fund Scheme. Accordingly vide Government of India in the Ministry of Labour Notification bearing G.S.R. No. 31, dated the 16th December 1978 the application of the Neyveli Coal Mines Provident Fund Scheme, 1966 has been rescinded and the lignite mines of the Corporation have also been covered by the Employees' Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provision Act, 1952 with effect from the 6th January 1979; the date from which the Neyveli Coal Mines Provident Fund Scheme, 1966 has been rescinded. The retrospective application shall not in any way affect adversely the interests of either the employer or the employees concerned.

Silk Textile Workers to Get More

Over 30,000 employees in the silk textile and textile processing industries in Greater Bombay will get an increase of Rs. 52 a month in their pay following an agreement between the Mill Mazdoor Sabha (MMS) and the Associations of Employers in the two industries. MMS President Kisan Tulpule said that the total wage rise per year in the two industries will be over Rs. 2.5 core.

Farm Labour Wages in Tamil Nadu-Revised

The Tamil Nadu Government has revised the minimum wages of agricultural labour with effect from September 15.

The revised rates varying from Rs. 5 to Rs. 12 per day depending upon the nature of employment would be applicable to the whole State, except the seven talukas in East Thanjavur, where the wages fixed under the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Labourer Fair Wages Act are in operation.

The revised rates, according to a Government press release, are: Employees engaged in ploughing with bullocks and ploughs brought by him—Rs. 12 per day; those engaged in ploughing with bullocks and ploughs supplied—Rs. 7 per day; those engaged in harvest in respect of paddy crop—Rs. 7 per day or cash value of the worker's share in 1/8th of the gross yield of produce, whichever is higher; those engaged in harvest in respect of crops other than paddy—Rs. 7 per day; those engaged in transplanting of weeding—Rs. 5 per day and employees engaged in other agricultural operations like trimming bunds climbing trees, poultry and dairy farming—Rs. 7 per day.

The society said that, according to a recent study in India, children contributed 23 per cent of the family income. To attempt to deprive facilities of this source will only cause greater misery.

The fundamental cause is poverty which requires sustained and long-term measures aided by the co-operation of the international community. Mobilisation of public concern is the responsibility of the Government. A plan of action will be the complex task for specialists. The International Labour Organisation should be invited to study the conditions and make recommendations.

The problem of child labour, the report says, is particularly acute in cities due to the influx of rural poor and the proportion of working children amongst them is specially high. About 80 per cent of children of migrants work compared to 19 per cent of urban resident children.

Lack of employment has brought these families from villages to cities and while fortunate in finding ways to support themselves, the families and children live and work in appalling conditions.

The Indian Constitution and laws protect children. But despite the provisions, children are still obliged to work in conditions dangerous to their health and development. While laws have laid down protection, the report points out oversights and ambiguities in legal codes allow employers to circumvent them. Not only do children still work in dangerous conditions, but their number in the work force is increasing.

The report observed, while Indian laws attempt to regulate some of the conditions, like hours of work and rest periods, they do not consider conditions in which children work and the specific needs of children as against those of adults, like education, welfare programmes and medical facilities.

Employees' Provident Funds Scheme to be Amended

The Central Board of Trustees Employees' Provident Fund which met at New Delhi on August 31, 1979, has recommended that the Employees' Provident Funds Scheme should be amended to enable the member to draw a non-refundable advance for the marriage of son also. At present this facility is provided for the marriage of the member and his daughter only. The Board also approved of setting up of a tripartite committee to go into the working of the sub-regional offices set up during the last three years to provide better services to the subscribers.

Maharashtra Government to spend Rs. 150 crores for EGS

The State Government of Maharashtra has allotted Rs. 150 crores for its Employment Guarantee Scheme (EGS) in the current financial year and 1980-81, to give daily employment to four to five lakhs of rural unemployed. The State spent Rs. 210 crores since the scheme was launched in 1973-74.

The full text of Governor's appeal is as follows:

The National Family Welfare Fortnight will be observed all over the country from 16 September. In Maharashtra, we are extending it till October 15, making it a whole month. During this period our effort will be to emphasise once again the need for limiting families in their own interest as well as in the interest of the nation. Through various health and other measures the population of our country is increasing rapidly. This is to a considerable extent defeating our effort to raise the standard of living for all our people and improve their quality of life. When we have a large family the mother suffers as well as the children. Every child which is brought into the world must have proper care and attention from his parents. We all want him to be a healthy and happy child, to have food, education and other necessities of life. But is it possible to achieve this when we have too many children? We can also easily imagine the strain it is on mothers. Their health suffers in many ways.

Ever since Independence we have been trying to achieve economic growth for all sections of our people but this continuous and rapid growth in population is coming in our way all the time. Hence this population policy to limit the growth of our families. This requires the active co-operation of every family in urban areas as well as in the vast countryside, among the rich or poor, educated or uneducated. As citizens of this great country we can each do his or her bit. We do not, in limiting our families, make any great sacrifice but rather we reduce our own suffering and increase our own well-being. We also lighten the burden on the State which is under an obligation to provide work, education and other necessities for everybody but the resources of the country are not limitless.

I believe our people will co-operate if they realise how vital family planning is for the good of our country. For carrying the message to every hearth and home, not once but a number of times, we need the co-operation of governmental and semi-governmental agencies, voluntary organisations, trade unions, teachers, leaders of public opinion and community leaders. May I earnestly appeal to all sections of society, to all citizens who have the welfare of the child, the mother and the nation at heart, to heed this call to limit our families and help to make the country strong and prosperous.

Maximum Child Labour in India

India has the largest child labour force in the world, with 16.5 million children between the ages of five and fourteen working in both rural and urban areas. The Anti-Slavery Society has reported:

In a report to the sub-commission of the UN Human Rights Commission, the society noted that the situation was due to the acute economic conditions. Any solution of the problem of child labour would have to allow children to work to earn the incomes they need and, at the same time, protect them from having to work in damaging, exploitative and hazardous conditions, it said.

Planning Commission to study Agyodaya Programme The Planning Commission will take up a quick evaluation study of the working of the Agyodaya Programme during October-November this year. The programme evaluation organisation of the commission will launch this study in Bihar, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Manipur, Orissa, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh. The main objectives of the evaluation will be to examine the criteria of selection of the Agyodaya families : type of benefit schemes envisaged and actually provided to the beneficiaries ; benefits accrued from the assistance provided with particular reference to income and its impact on the economic status of the beneficiaries ; steps taken for efficient implementation, and follow-up including extension, management production and marketing and attitude and reaction of other villagers towards the programme.

The Agyodaya Programme aims at the emancipation of the "Last-man" of Gandhi's description. Mahatma Gandhi said that one should recall the face of the poorest and weakest in all steps that one contemplated to undertake.

As the term Agyodaya signifies, it envisages the upliftment of the poorest amongst the poor families in the rural community. It necessitates identification of the poorest families in the villages, devising programmes for their upliftment and then providing means for standing on their feet by way of self-employment through occupations like agriculture, animal husbandry, and cottage industries and also wage employment on various works. A micro approach with family as the unit of development has been adopted in this programme.

REDUCE FAMILY TO REDUCE SUFFERINGS.—Governor's Appeal on the eve of National Family Welfare Fortnight.

Bombay, September 15 : "We do not, in limiting our families, make any great sacrifice, but rather we reduce our own suffering and increase our own well being", said Shri Sadiq Ali, Governor of Maharashtra, in his appeal to the people on the eve of the National Family Welfare Fortnight.

The Governor made this appeal in a broadcast from the All India Radio, Bombay tonight.

Rapidly increasing population, Shri Sadiq Ali said, was to a considerable extent defeating out efforts to raise the standard of living for all our people and improve their quality of life. He therefore, appealed to all sections of the society to heed the call to limit our family and help to make the country strong and prosperous.

Industrial Disputes in Maharashtra State

During July 1979, there were 15 disputes involving 1370 workmen and a time loss of 29157 working days, as compared to 30 disputes in June 1979 involving 3583 workmen and a time loss of 53, 176 mandays. Further Particulars of Industrial Disputes are given at Pages 175 and 176 of this issue.

Benefits under the E.S.I. Scheme

During the month of August 1979, 14011 Insured persons received Rs. 32,26,077.15 cash benefits due to employment injuries. This includes 4703 persons who were in receipt of pensions for Permanent Disablement and 1784 persons who were in receipt of Dependant Benefit as dependents of deceased Insured persons. During the month, 10528 accidents were reported as against 8592 during the preceding month.
