


All India Average Consumber Price Index Number for Industrial workers (General) on Base 1960=100 for March 1979 was 332 as compared to 329 in February 1979. The Index Number for March 1979 on base 1949=100 derived from 1960 based index worked out to 404 as against 400 for February 1979.

Industrial Disputes in Maharashtra State

During February 1979, there were 41 strikes involving 67,302 workmen and a time loss of 2,72,578 mandays as compared to 57 disputes in January 1979 involving 19,788 workmen and a time loss of 1,79,521 mandays. Further particulars of Industrial Disputes are given at pages 831 and 832 of this issue.

Benefits under the E. S. I. Scheme

During the month of March 1979, 14,302 Insured Persons received Rs. 28,68,788.11 cash benefits due to employment injuries. This includes 4293 persons who were in receipt of pensions for Permanent Disablement and 1733 persons who were in receipt of Dependant Benefit as dependants of deceased Insured Persons. During the month, 11,682 accidents were reported as against 10,603 during the preceding month.

The Government proposes that during the International Year of the Child, its endeavours to promote programmes of health and development of the child and a happy family life should be strenthened and given more purposeful thrust. In this endeavour I appeal for co-operation and would urge:

- (1) all of you to donate liberally to the National Children's Funds being set up both at the Centre as well as in the States;
- (2) voluntary organisations to adopt the Child welfare scheme outlined in the National Plan of Action;


Jobs for Released Bonded Labourers

Government has decided to allow age-relaxation upto 40 years to all those who have been released from the bonded labour system for recuritment to group 'c' and group 'd' posts under the Government, in its endeavour to explore all possible avenues for the speedier rehabilitation of the released bonded labour.

For the purpose of employment through the Employment Exchanges, persons released from the bonded labour system shall be accorded priority as is given to the phisically handicapped.

Chief Secretaries of all the State Government, who generally hold charge of the General Administration Departments in the States, have been addressed to extend similar age-relaxation and priority to the released bonded labour for recruitment to comparable posts in the state services.

Besides studies and surveys undertaken by the State Governments for the indentification of bonded labour, the Central Government have sponsored studies by the Indian Institutes of Public Administration in Palamau districts of Bihar and by the National Labour Institute in the Union Territory of Gao, Daman and Diu. Active assistance is also provided to the Gandhi Peace Foundation and the National Labour Institute for completing national survey on the incidence of bonded labour, in 1,000 villages of 19 States from May to October, 1978. The accent during the 6th five year plan if the co-operative sector will be on the development of agriculture and growth of labour-intensive small and village industries.

According to the annual report for Co-operation and Civil Supplies Department, steps have already been taken to ensure that the co-operatives are built up into strong and viable organisations to promote total and comprehensive rural development by progressively strengthening the links between credit, supply of agricultural inputs, agricultural production including ancillary activities like dairy, poultry, fishery and piggary marketing of agricultural produce to the best advantage of the producer members to ensure remunerarive prices and distribution of essential consumer articles.

The report adds that as regards credit, programmes have also been drawn to enable the co-operatives to serve increasingly the small and marginal farmers and agricultural labourers who belong to the weaker sections of the society. The co-operative merketing infra-structure is being strengthened to bring about a more effective system of marketing of members' produce, supply of agricultural inputs and distribution of consumer goods. More agricultural commodities are being brought under the price support programmes with the involvement of co-operatives in the procurement operations. With a view to providing increased employment opportunities in the rural areas, co-operative processing and agro-based industries are being developed systematically.


Urban consumer co-operatives and the marketing and the service co-operatives in the rural areas are being strengthened in the context of establishing a strong and comprehensive public distribution system.

E. G. S. : A PROGRAMME AGAINST POVERTY

One of the most important schemes being implemented by the State Government for the benefit of the rural poor is the Employment Guarantee Scheme. The State Legislature had passed the Maharashtra Employment Guarantee Bill, 1977, which was sent for Presidential assent. In the meantime, the State Government decided to give effect to the main provision of this Bill including the provision relating to the payment of unemployment allowance, through administrative orders, with effect from 9th August, 1978. The State Government has by notification brought the Maharashtra Employment Guarantee Act, 1977, into force with effect from 26th January 1979. The guarantee of employment now has a statutory base.

The guarantee of work constitutes a major and fundamental objective of Government's fiscal and economic policy and is intended to provide the first step towards implementing the right to work enshrined in Article 41 of the Constitution.

The aim of the scheme is to provide gainful and productive employment gainful to the individual and productive to the economy in approved works to all unskilled persons in the rural areas including the areas of 'C' class municiapal councils, who need work and are prepared to do manual labour but cannot find it on their own. The guarantee of work is restricted to unskilled manual work.

The State Government has to make a matching contribution equal to the net collection of taxes and levies every year. The net collection of taxes and levies and the matching contribution from the State Government have to be credited to a separeat fund called the employment guarantee fund which has been constituted to ensure that the resources raised for the purpose of the implementation of the E.G.S. are utilised for the same only.

ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

The District Collector is in overall charge of the scheme. He has to accord sanction to the works from amongst those included in the blue prints and approved by the District Planning and Development Councils. The collectors are empowered to sanction the works costing up to Rs. 10 lakhs. If works costing more than Rs. 10 lakhs are to be undertaken, the collectors have to obtain the prior approval of the Government.

The works are implemented through the serveral government departments like irrigation, public works and housing, soil conservation and forest departments and the zilla parishads. Arrangements for drinking water, sanitary arrangements and medical aid are made and whenever work is provided beyond 5 kms. from the village, arrangements for camping have also to be provided.

Three tier administrative set up has been evolved for execution of employment guarantee scheme works. To ensure close and effective lision and continuous supervision over the programme, committees for planning, direction, control., co-ordination and evaluation have been set up at the State, distirct and panchayat samiti (tahsil) levels.


At the State level the planning department is in overall charge of the programme covering all aspects of planning, administration, provision of funds, monitoring and evaluation of the rural employment programme. The Collector is in over all charge of the programme at the district level and looks after the planning, implementation, co-ordination, monitoring, supervision and inspection aspects of the programme.

At panchayat samiti level besides other related matters, the tahsildar has been assigned the functions of assessment of the demand for employment and development of employment seekers on different works under execution in the panchayat samiti.

In order to ensure proper technical supervision of the works and compliance of the Government instructions, on inspection cell has been recently created in the offices of the divisional commissioners.

PEOPLE'S PARTICIPATION

Under the Employment Guarantee Act the State Government has to constitute a District Employment Guarantee Committee in every district and a Panchayat Employment Guarantee Committee in every panchayat samiti area. A special committee of the Legislatiure has also been appointed to go

PARTICIPATION IN MANAGEMENT

3-tier Workers' Say Mooted

A three-tier system of workers' participation in management—at shop, plant and corporate or board level—has been suggested by the committee on workers' participation headed by the Union Labour Minister, Shri Ravindra Varma, according to a news agency report.

The committee is understood to have stressed the importance of introducting a scheme of legislation on workers' participation and said it should cover all such undertakings employing 500 or more workers irrespective of the fact whether it is in public, private of co-operative sector.

It is also of the view that there should be a provision for extending it to units with atleast 100 workers.

The representatives at the participative forums should be elected through secret ballot. The committee has suggested that there should be parity between the representatives of employers and workers on the participative forums at shop and plant levels but could not agree on the number of workers' representatives at the corporate level.

On equiry participation, the majority of the committee are understood to have expressed the view that it should be optional and should not be looked upon as a legal means to ensure participation in management. It is also generally agreed that not less than 10 per cent of all new shares issued in future by a company should be reserved exclusively as workers' share and offered to the workers of that company.


The argument that the representatives at the various participating forums should be elected by a secret ballot became necessary in order to avoid any possible friction between the collective bargaining agent and the representatives.

The members of the committee felt that supervisors and the middle management should have representation in the participative forums so that they could be fully involved in the decision making process.

The employers' representatives of private sector did not subscribe to the idea of giving separate representation to the supervisors and middle management. The majority of members, however, are reported to have expressed the view that it was not correct in the real sense of term that officers ipso facto were part of the management. They argued that even among the professional managements, there was a hierarchy of professionals from supervisors upwards.

At the shop level, the participative arrangement will cover common production facilities, storage facilities, material economy errors in documents, operational problems, wastage control, safely problems, quality improvement, monthly production schedules and targets, cost reduction programmes, technological innovations in the shop etc.

The plant-level participation has been enlarged to cover areas like operations, economies and finance, personnel, welfare measures and environment. Some of the important functions include evolution of productivity schemes, materials supply, quality of inputs, storage and inventories, sharing gains of productivity.

The commission said that it had not decided on any single approach to measure hardship but suggested a variety of ways to develop a ltardship index by interrelating the labour force count with earnings and family income.

The panel noted that the national unemployment rate, announced monthly by the Buleau of Labour Statistics, is not nearly so crucial in determining the allocation of federal grants as are the official estimates of state and local unemployment. It gave the national figure, derived from a monthly Census Bureau Survey of 56,000 households, high marks for accuracy but expressed on similar confidence in the state and local figures.

The accuracy of the statistics is extremely important, since the figures determine how more than 10 million a year in federal dollars are distributed among states and localities for public service jobs, economic development and other programmes.

To improve state reporting, one recommendation would allocate funds to train state officers.

Other recommendations include :—

Broadening the size of the Census Bureau Survey on which BLS derives its monthly jobless data, from the present 56,000 households to 160,000 at a cost of about \$36 million a year. The expanded sampling would provide more data for states and metropolitan areas and cities with over one million residents, particularly regarding blacks and Hispanics.

Counting military personnel when computing the number of jobholders and thus the jobless rate. The abolition of the draft and the establishments of a voluntary military force have "outdated the idea that military personnel should be excluded from the official employment figures," the panel said.


"Employment in the volunteer armed forces no longer appears to be substantively different from other employment situations," it observed. "Individuals are free to choose between employment in the military or civilian sector. Pay scales between the two sectors have become more competitive."


But the commission stressed that the military should not be included in figures on localities because it would distort the status of job opportunities in a community and military personnel generally leave the area at the end of their tour of duty.

The commission found too many technical difficulties in labour's proposal that so-called "discouraged" workers be counted as unemployed. These are workers who give up looking for employment in the belief that there are no jobs to be found.

It said that it had not yet decided whether to recommend that 16 and 17 year-olds be excluded from the official labour force count. Nearly 90 percent of all workers in this age category are in school, and most have only a "casual" attachment to the labour force, the panel observed.

The commission noted, however, that age 16 is a standard in many labour market matters, and made recommendations for the collection of additional


The pattern of industrial development of Maharashtra is also quite broad based. About 20 years ago the textile industry dominated the industrial scene of the State. But, to-day along with textile, progress has been achieved in the field of engineering industries, manufacturing of machine tools, industrial plants and equipment and agricultural implements, basic, chemical industries, dyestuffs, synthetic fibres and plastic industries, phermaceuticals etc. Progress has been made in development of agro-industries.

The regional balance or equitable participation by all regions of the State in the process as well as in the benefit of development is one of the major objectives of planned development. The development programmes of the State have been in a manner that the life becomes richer and fuller not for a few but for all.

The need for dispersal of industries as a means for achieving balanced development of all the regions has been appreciated by the Government. Special efforts are being made to encourage industrial development of the under-developed areas. The State Industrial and Investment Corporation of Maharashtra Limited (SICOM), has been set up with the principal objective of promoting industrial development of under-developed areas. The Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation Limited (MIDC) has been active in the field of providing developed land and other infrastructural facilities in the under-developed areas.

Bombay is considered as the industrial nerve centre of India. The rapid growth of industries in the State and the diversity of the goods being produced by the industries of Maharashtra are certainly noteworthy. This rapid industrial development has tended to concentrate in the Bombay-Thane-Pune belt, and if we leave this areas out of consideration, the remaining part of the State remains industrially under-developed.

Industrial development has also led to excessive urbanisation and just as Maharashtra contributed a large portion of the total industrial production of the country, the State also leads the country in the process of urbanisation. Naturally, a great emphasis is being laid on dispersal of industries in the State.

Export Promotion

The State Board for Export Promotion and panels thereunder, which were set up in June 1965, have been discontinued since September 1976. However, State Committee for Export Promotion continues functioning as an advisory body and the export promotion cell to work as secretariate to the committee.

Maharashtra accounts for approximately 26 per cent of the total exports from the country.

Production of Minerals

The prominent minerals exploited in the State are manganese ore, coal, iron ore, silica sand, dolomite, kyanite, bauxite, chromite, white clay, gypsum soapstone, china clay and common sand. The major mineral production comes from the Nagpur Division (Vidarbha area) followed by Ratnagiri and Kolhapur districts. The number of mining leases existing presently in the state are 268.

The chief minerals exported from the State are iron ore and manganese ore. Of late, kyanite from Bhandara district is also being exported. The export of iron ore from Ratnagiri district shows a continuous rising trend whereas the export of manganese ore from Nagpur and Bhandara districts shows a some what falling trend. This is because the international demand for manganese ore has gone down and further because as a matter of policy, the Government is not encouraging the export of manganese ore in view of the anticipated demand, in future for manganese ore in the country.

During 1973 and 1974, the total average daily labour employment in major mineral mines of the State was 16,453 and 16,491 respectively.

As a result of the discoveries of mineral deposits by the Directorate of Geology and Mining which has helped in the increase in production, there has been an increase of mineral revenue from Rs. 27.44 lakhs in 1963-64 to Rs. 95.79 lakhs in 1974-75.


Industrial Development Corporation

The MIDC was established in 1962 with the objective of securing and assisting the rapid and orderly establishment and two or three industrial areas around the Bombay-Thane complex but now it has 52 well developed areas all over the State. By the end of this year there will be at least one industrial area in each district of the State.

In the earlier years, most of the MIDC'S development expenditure was in the developed areas of the State but over the years a significant shift has taken place. Up to 1972-73 the expenditure in the developed areas was Rs. 5.45 crores compared to Rs. 2.75 lakhs in the backward areas but during the last three years, the expenditure in the developed parts is only Rs. 194 lakhs compared to almost Rs. 600 lakhs spent in the backward areas.

So far Rs. 30.73 crores have been spent by the corporation on the development of water supply schemes which have an installed capacity of five lakhs cubic metres per day. Large water works have been undertaken in backward

Development of Leather Industry

The Leather Industries Development Corporation of Maharashtra Limited was incorporated as a Government company from 1st May 1974 with an authorised capital of Rs. 5 crores. The activities of the Corporation include production of Kolhapuri chappals, purchase of footwear from the small artisans in Miraj Kupwad area and selling them in cities like Bombay through the agency of the Corporation. Articles like washers, office bags, fancy chappals etc. are purchased from the local artisans and they are marketed in cities. In order to provide employment to the weaker section, namely, road side cobblers, efforts are being made to provide them stalls.

Regional Development Corporation

In addition to State level corporations the State Government has also set up Regional Corporations in order to promote, encourage and assist the orderly establishment, growth and development of industries and industrialisation in different regions of Maharashtra and to prepare, undertake and promote industrial projects solely or jointly with the Government or with other agencies, the four regional corporations were established viz:—


- (1) Marathwada Development Corporation Limited was incorporated in August 1967. Its authorised capital is Rs. 3 cores. In pursuance of the main object of promoting and developing industries in Marathwada region the Corporation has already implemented an integrated powerlooms project and has undertaken a cattle development and dairy programme on a large scale.
- (2) The Development Corporation of Vidarbha Limited was incorporated on December 3, 1970. The authorised share capital of the Corporation is rupees one crore.
- (3) The Western Maharashtra Development Corporation Limited, was incorporated on December 3, 1970 as a private Limited Company with an authorised capital of Rs. 1 crore. The paid up capital is Rs. 70 lakhs.
- (4) The Development Corporation of Konkan Limited was set up on December 3, 1970 as a private limited company, with an authorised capital of Rs. 1 crore. The main object of the company has been to promote industries based on the raw materials available in Konkan region.

Ancillary Industry

The development of ancillary industry in Maharashtra has been equally impressive during the last two decades. This is natural because almost all the medium and large industries which have a large ancillary potential are developed in the State.

The ancillary items include parts, components and sub-assemblies of automobiles, mopeds and scooters, bicycles, machine tools, electronics, diesel engines, ships and trawlers, etc. The ancillary relationship is predominantly with private sector industries rather than with public sectior undertakings.

of large-scale ural economy refore, rightly puts stress on accelerating the process of developing small village and cottage industries in the rural areas.

For this purpose, a new strategy, namely, the creation of a new institutional mechanism, named as district industries centre (DIC) has been devised. The district will be the focal point and an entrepreneur interested in setting up small/cottage industry in the rural areas, should be able to get the entire package of assistance which he needs under one roof, namely, of the DIC. Fourteen such DICs have already been set up in Maharashtra in the first phase on May 1, 1978 and they have started functioning. In the second phase DICs for the remaining 11 districts have been established from March 15, 1979. Each DIC has an advisory committee headed by the District Collector and as similar committee at the State level is also set up. Maharashtra State is thus poised to take a longer and higher leap on the path of rural industrialisation.


The work is gathering momentum, as is evident from the fact that the number of persons availing of assistance under the Employment Promotion Programme has gone up from 155 in May 1978 to 348 in July 1978, and the corresponding increase in seed money sanctioned is from Rs. 5.44 lakhs to Rs. 10.39 lakhs.

Prospects

The development of off-shore oil-fields at Bombay High and at nearby Bassein North oil-fields marks a cheerful event in the industrial development of the State. The ambitious plans of completing the physical infranstructure to step up the crude oil up to 13 to 14 million tonnes per year and a gas production at the rate 3.10 million cubic meters per day by 1980 will shortly boost the industrial activities of the State. Hundreds of crores of rupees are expected to be invested in the refineries; petro-chemicals and fertilisers industries. This would also give a boost to other industries like plastic processing, dyes and intermediates, pharmaceuticals and other organic chemicals which are based on the down stream products of the petro-chemical industries. The development of minerals in the Vidarbha and Ratnagiri areas offer a high promise for the growth of coal-based and iron ore-based industries in Vidarbha area such as fertilisers steel plants and boxite based industries like, alumina, aluminium and aluminium products in Ratnagiri area.

The launching of deep fishing programme in the coastal districts of Thane, Kulaba and Ratnagiri has opened out new vistas for the development of intergrated marine industries complex comprising ship-yards for travlers and barges, fish processing, deep freezing, cold storage and canning units, fish netting units and a host of ancillary units to fees the shipyard.

Many of the irrigation projects like Jayakwadi project on the Godavari, Ujani projects on the Bhima etc. offerer large irrigation facilities. This will give a further fill-up to the growth of a variety of agro-industries both on the input and output sides such as agriculture I machinery and equipment, agrochemicals like pesticide and fertiliser formulation and a number of processed and conversion products.

No. 2 OF 1979


Promulgated by the President in the Thirtieth Year of the Republic of India

An Ordinance to amend the Sugar Undertakings (Takings Over of Management) Act, 1978.

WHEREAS Parliament is not in session and the President is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action;

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 123 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to promulgate the following Ordinance:—

- 1. Short title and commencement.—(1) This Ordinance may be called the Sugar undertakings (Taking Over of Management) Amendment Ordinance, 1979.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.
- 2. Amendment of section 3 of Act 49 of 1978.—In section 3 of the Sugar Undertakings (Taking Over of Management) Act, 1978 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), in sub-section (1), in clause (b), for the words "purchased before that date", the following shall be substituted and shall be deemed always to have been substituted, namely:—
 - "purchased, at any time (whether in that sugar year or in any earlier sugar year or sugar years and whether before or after the commencement of this Act), before that date".
- 3. Validation.—Notwithstanding any judgment, decree or order (whether interim or otherwise) of any court, anything or any action (including the issue by the Central Government of any notification declaring that the management of any sugar undertaking shall vest in the Central Government on and from the date specified in such notification) done or taken or purported to have been done or taken under section 3 of the principal Act or under the corresponding provisions of the Ordinance which was repealed by the principal Act, shall, for all purposes, be deemed to be and to have always been so validly done or taken as if such thing or action (including the issue of such notification)





In March 1979 the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Bombay Centre with base January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 326 being 3 points higher than that in the preceding month. The lndex relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at the Bombay Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 1 point to 339 due to a fall in the average prices of jowar, bajra, arhardal, gramdal, masurdal, salt, turmeric, chillies dry, onion, garlic, coconut, kalimiri, zeera, potatoes, tomatoes and ghee.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc., group increased by 15 points to 359 due to rise in the average prices of supari, bidi and cigarettes.

The index number for the fuel and light group, increased by 25 points to 429 due to a rise in the average price of fire-wood, kerosene oil, coal and match box.

The index number for housing remained steady at 153, being a six monthly

The index number for the clothing, bedding and footwear group increased by 3 points to 354 due to a rise in the average prices of dhoti, saree, mulmul, longcloth, full pant, vest, markin, shoes and chapple.







348-A rise of 1 point:

In March 1979, the Consumer Price Indix Number for Working Class for Nanded Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 348 being 1 point higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at Nanded Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 7 points to 366 due to a fall in the average prices of wheat, jowar, turdal, uriddal, chillies dry and tamarind.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 8 points to 461 due to a rise in the average prices of kerosene and match box.

The index number for housing remained steady at 196 (being six monthly item).

The index number for the clothing and footwear group increased by 2 points to 331 due to a rise in the prices of dhoti, long cloth and coluured polin.

In March 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class for Jalgaon Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 331 being 2 points lower than that in the preceding month. In March 1979, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series), for Pune Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 346 being 1 point lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family ilving survey at Pune Centre.

The index number for the food group decreased by 7 points to 334 due to a fall in the average prices of jowar, bajri, turdal, fresh fish, eggs, ghee, potatoes, onions, brinjals, tomatoes, other vegetables and banana.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 24 points to 406 due to a rise in the average prices of raywal, kerosene oil and match box.

The index number for housing remained steady at 130 (being six monthly items).

The index number for the clothing and footwear group increased by 1 point to 365 due to a rise in the prices of saree, and long cloth.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 6 points to 259 due to a rise in the prices of cigerattes, utensils, washing soap, lifebuoy, lux, tooth powder and shaving blade.
